

WILSON ADDRESSES  
CONGRESS: URGES  
CURRENCY REFORM

President Tells Congressmen That Country Expects Immediate Action in Revising Laws on Money Questions

"IT IS OUR DUTY," HE DECLARES TO LAWMAKERS  
Galleries and Corridors of House of Representatives Packed Long Before President Arrived

WASHINGTON, June 23.—Hearing a personal plea for immediate action by congress to revise the banking and currency laws, that business may be able to continue to flourish, President Wilson today personally read his address on the subject to both houses of congress assembled in joint session.

Although aware of some of the points that attended his first appearance, when he upset presidential traditions more than a century, by making a visit of the president to congress took on a deeper significance.

On his first visit he delivered a message long anticipated, urging the carrying out of the party's pledge for immediate action on the currency reform. His address today was an appeal to every member of the house and senate to lay aside personal considerations and to support the currency reform as a necessary step to secure an open revision and reform of the nation's banking system. Only in that way, he declared, could the country secure the benefit of the tariff revision soon to be completed.

"IT IS OUR DUTY," he said, "to be perfectly clear that it is our duty to supply the new banking and currency system the country needs, and that it will be immediate need. It is more than that," said President Wilson. 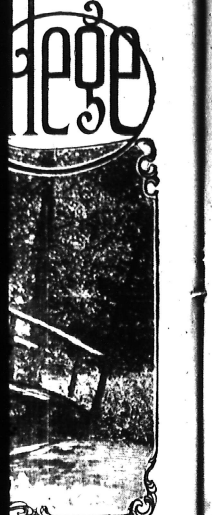
